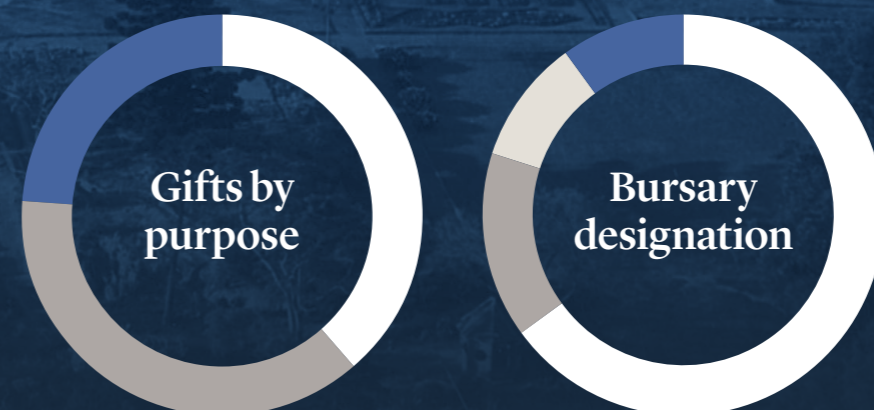

2024 DONOR THANKSGIVING MASS AND RECEPTION

The evening began with a Mass of Thanksgiving in the Dalton Chapel, celebrated by our College Rector, Fr Tom Renshaw SJ (OR1990), and was beautifully enhanced by musical contributions from The Ignatian Choir. During the reception in the Quadrangle, our guests were touched by reflections from former Bursary recipient Denzel Tighe (OR2013) and Bursary student Isaac Ford (OR2024).

The night also featured engaging performances by our Chamber Orchestra and talented Year 12 students, adding special elements to the reception.



ISAAC FORD (OR2024) FORMER BURSARY STUDENT

Isaac, originally from Bourke, joined the College as a boarder in Year 7 and immersed himself in school life. In his final year, Isaac served as Captain of Romero House and as a Boarding Proctor. Isaac excelled both academically and in public speaking and drama, earning numerous academic awards throughout his time at the College.

In May 2024, Isaac won the Lawrence Campbell Oratory Competition, the most prestigious and challenging public speaking competition in Australia. Previous winners include Malcolm Turnbull, Nick Greiner, Justin Greiner (OR1990) and Bas Braham (OR2019). Isaac's grace, eloquence and diligent training led to this outstanding result.

Isaac was awarded the prestigious Tuckwell Scholarship at Australian National University for 2025. Each year, this scholarship is granted to 25 outstanding school-leavers, giving them the opportunity to learn and grow at ANU.

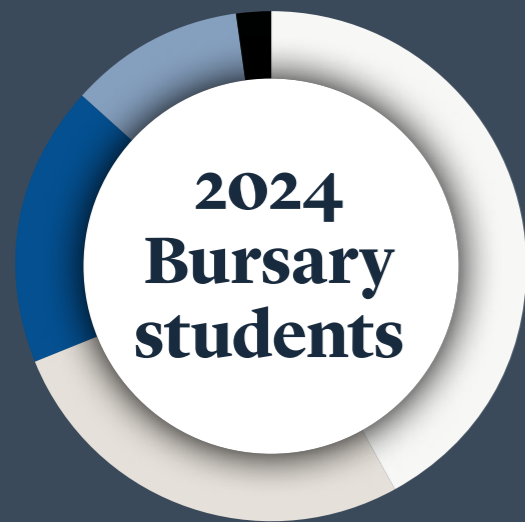

Our Bursary students come from diverse backgrounds, including First Nations communities, refugee families, rural areas and the suburbs of Sydney. Each student is a valued member of the community, enriching the College with their unique experiences and perspectives.

Through the Program, the College actively engages with under-served communities while making a strong commitment to each individual student accepted into the Bursary Program.

We are dedicated to fostering a diverse and inclusive environment in which all students can flourish and grow into 'men for and with others.' The Bursary Program is integral to this mission.

Bursaries are granted based on financial need, and the College does not award scholarships based on academic, musical or sporting prowess.

OUR ANNUAL BURSARY APPEAL

Our annual mid-year Bursary Appeal is the cornerstone fundraising activity in support of the Bursary Program, reinforcing our tradition of offering a transformative Jesuit education through needs-based support. Since then he has performed on stages across Australia, as well as appearing on TV and voiceover work. Joseph always sought to make the most of every opportunity offered to him at the College. THE FIRST NATIONS PROGRAM

The College is actively committed to redressing the inequalities of access and educational outcomes, and through our First Nations Program, we support our First Nations students to reach their fullest potential.

Aligned with the College's Jesuit values of justice and equality, our First Nations Program aims to inspire every student to thrive and make a positive impact both during their time at school and beyond. Since the College enrolled its first Indigenous students in the 1980s, the Program has grown to become one of Australia's largest school-based First Nations initiatives in a metropolitan setting.

Under the leadership of our First Nations Coordinator, students benefit from a specialised support team, including dedicated Learning Enrichment staff and holistic involvement from the community at all levels. To help nurture their future university

and career goals, Indigenous students receive individual mentorship from members of our Old Boy and current parent communities, along with access to Cultural Support Tutors and Volunteer Academic Tutors.

We celebrate the rich cultural heritage and identity that the First Nations students and their families bring, recognising their significant role in enhancing our community's understanding of Indigenous cultures and the wider world around us. The First Nations Program embodies the College's commitment to diversity and inclusion, helping us move towards a more united and just society.

Financial support for our First Nations students comes from their families, organisations such as Yalari and the Australian Indigenous Education Foundation (AIEF), and the College's Bursary Fund.

HOW THE BURSARY PROGRAM IS FUNDED

The Bursary Program is entirely funded by the generous contributions of our benefactors. All gifts are tax-deductible and used exclusively to support bursary students.

Throughout the year, the Riverview College Foundation organises various fundraising activities to support the Bursary Program, principal of which is the annual mid-year appeal.

A huge point of difference at Riverview is that we only offer means-tested bursaries, and not scholarships. This directly benefits the bursary recipients and their families,

but also contributes immeasurably to the school's overall culture and diversity.

Some of my greatest friends from my time at Riverview were on a bursary, although I didn't realise it at the time. The kindness and generosity of others enabled them to come to the school, and on a personal level I'm very grateful for the chance they had to experience a Riverview education.

I genuinely believe in the ripple effect that the Bursary Program can have - each individual bursary recipient, whether a country boarder, a First Nations student or a student from a refugee background, can take the values they learn at Riverview back into their families and their communities. Our hope is that they will build on what they learn at school and go on to positively impact their communities and society - and this can have an effect over many generations.

I ask everyone - including Old Boys like me - to keep the Bursary Appeal front of mind. It's a wonderful cause to support, and even the smallest contribution has real impact, helping to fund an education for someone who wouldn't otherwise be able to attend Riverview.

Since establishment in 1880, the College has continued to evolve and develop, in line with our Jesuit mission to excel in both teaching and pastoral care. Each project and milestone is underpinned by our proud and distinguished history, as we seek to expand our facilities for the benefit of our students – now and in future generations.

2018

The Therry Building was completed in 2018 with the generous support of our community. This contemporary facility includes 24 modern learning spaces and six House areas.

2025

Wingaru, our new science and technology building, is set to be completed in 2025. This transformational facility will feature 35 state-of-the-art learning spaces, six House areas, a dedicated First Nations space, our Centre for Learning Enrichment and a new canteen.



AN EVOLVING RIVERVIEW



1880

1878 28 June
Father Joseph Dalton SJ purchases Riverview Estate, following a significant bequest from Father John Therry.

1880 12 February
The College opens its doors with just one cottage serving as classroom, dormitory, chapel and refectory.

1880 September
St Michael's House is completed in the College's foundation year.

1885-1889
The first major building project is completed as the western end of the Main Building (Arrupe) opens.

1908
Father Edward Pigot SJ establishes the Riverview Observatory. At the time, it was the only fully equipped seismological observatory in Australia.

1909 23 May
Dalton Memorial Chapel Opening ceremony held. A startling art nouveau creation and still an outstanding example of the style, the Chapel is the Old Ignatians' official monument to College founder, Father Joseph Dalton SJ.

1929-1930
The Main Building (Arrupe) is completed in time for the 50th Anniversary of the College – Eastern and Doyle Wings added and the Dalton Memorial Chapel is expanded.

1958-1959
Wallace Wing classrooms, study hall and science block completed.

1964 February
The Junior School (Regis Campus) opens.

1969-1973
The largest building program ever undertaken since 1885 at the College takes place, including the Vaughan Wing, the Therry Wing, and Saint John's Boarding House.

1985-1995
The Gartlan Centre, The Woods Music Centre, Ramsay Hall, and O'Kelly Theatre are completed.

2000 20 August
Kevin Fagan House for senior boarding students opens.

2003
O'Neil Wing and Therry Campus open.

2008 2 November
Official opening of the renewed Dalton Memorial Chapel and Christopher Brennan Library.

2018
Therry Building opens, "invoking the best in modern educational practice, particularly diverse teaching and learning methodologies." Dr Paul Hine, former Principal, quoted in *Our Alma Mater* 2018.

2024
The establishment of the Faber Farm & Agriculture Precinct.

Wingar, our new science
and technology wing.

Wingar is one of our most significant building endeavours since the iconic sandstone Arrupe building.

This transformational educational facility is designed to meet the evolving needs of the next generation of students through its specialised teaching and learning spaces. Wingaru's design supports both interdisciplinary and project-based learning and the teaching of subjects such as Science, Technology and Applied Studies, Mathematics, and Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE). By creating this bespoke new environment, we aim to equip our graduates with critical thinking skills for future careers in these fields.

Aligned with our Jesuit commitment to *cura personalis*, Wingaru's layout integrates House areas with faculty spaces to enhance the connection between learning and wellbeing.

Wingar will be home to our First Nations Centre as well as our Learning Enrichment Faculty, placing these key areas within the heart of the College's teaching and learning precinct.

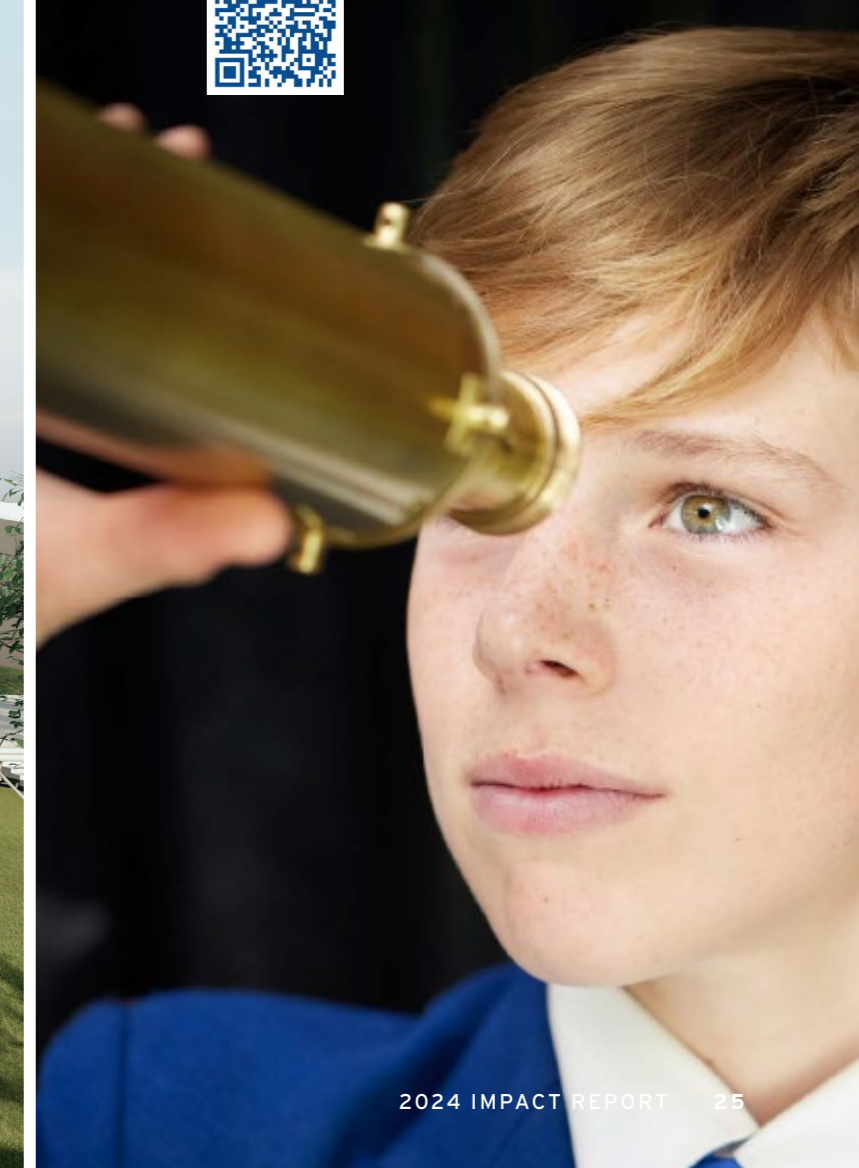
