


A Gift in Your Will... Your legacy, their future.





An Inspired Legacy

Bequests have played a critical role in the establishment and evolution of Saint Ignatius' College Riverview.

Father John Joseph Therry, considered to be one of the founders of the College, along with Archbishop Vaughan and Fr Joseph Dalton SJ, was a visionary who worked tirelessly to establish churches and schools throughout Sydney. It was his bequest in 1864 to the Society of Jesus that enabled the establishment of Saint Ignatius' College Riverview.

Described as "a man of large notions and considerable achievement... [who] firmly believed in a distant future for which he built" (*Australian Dictionary of Biography*), it is Fr Therry's belief in the future that made possible the campus that we see today.

RIVERVIEW BURSARY PROGRAM


CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

Michael Andrew Smith (1953 – 2006) Benefactor of The Smithy Bursary


Michael was born in Sydney and started at Riverview in 1966, where he made important lifelong mates. At the College, Mike loved rowing, being part of the 1st XV rugby team and his hero was Coach Les Kirkpatrick. He went on to study law but soon forged a career as a talented mainframe programmer and systems analyst.

Shortly after turning fifty, Mike was unfortunately diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. The grave news forced him to consider how to spend his final days; his 'bucket list' included some travel, important reconnections with special people and places and the inevitable reflection on his life and legacy.

During his final chapter, he and his family received loyal and affectionate support from his Riverview mates. The Old Boys exemplified the Ignatian spirit and Michael was fondly farewelled at a Requiem Mass in the Dalton Chapel at the College.

Michael Smith bequeathed his estate to establish The Smithy Bursary so that others less fortunate might also share the spirit of Saint Ignatius. His sister Michele said, "We are proud that Michael chose to give something back to his other family, the community he so obviously valued and which supported him. This, his final act, was befitting of an Old Ignatian."
